



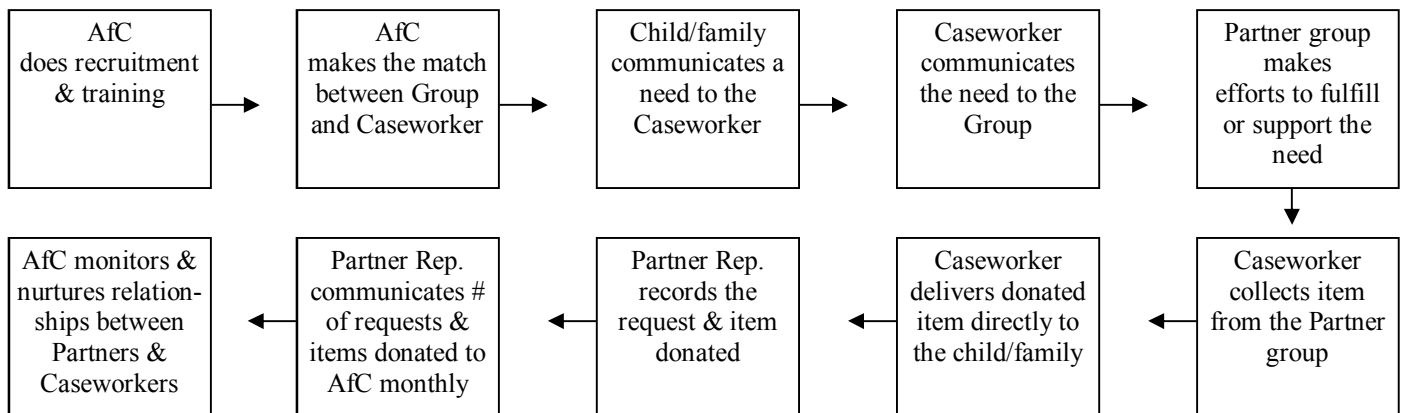
Adopt-a-Caseworker

At-a-Glance

Ambassadors for Children recruits Partner groups to participate in the program and matches them with a Greene County child protective Caseworker. Matches are based on caseload needs, Partner group resource capacity, and Partner group preferences (when possible). Ambassadors for Children will provide training information for Caseworkers and Partner groups, will maintain program data, and will help nurture relationships between Caseworkers and Partners.



Once matched, the caseworker communicates the specific needs of the children/families on his/her caseload to the Partner group. The Caseworker is the bridge to maintain confidentiality.



Any size group can participate. Individuals may also participate.

Any type of group can participate (Faith, Church, Business, Civic, Student, etc...).

Your Partner group can coordinate efforts internally, in whatever way works best for you.

Needs are **Specific**, communicated **Directly**, and responded to **Immediately**.

Nearly 70 Child Protective Caseworkers need to be "adopted" in Greene County.

Over 1,600 children received some level of Greene County child protective services in 2007...that's over 1,600 potential opportunities to help.
